22/29 Agree Budget for the new financial year

The Chair of the Personnel & Finance Committee said that the committee proposed that the budget plan for 2022/23 that has been prepared by the school should be agreed.

The governors unanimously approved and agreed the budget plan for 2022/23.

22/30 | Headteacher's Report

Pupils

There are currently 435 pupils on roll, with 2 spaces in Year 3 and I over PAN in Year 1. The EYFS September 2022 intake is full and there are pupils on the waiting list.

Attendance

Attendance has improved since Easter, the school is seeing fewer cases of Covid and there are fewer staff absences. Overall attendance is 93.%. The attendance of the 14 FSM pupils is 92.7% and the 16 Combined FSM and Ever 6 is 92.8%. Overall attendance of the 20 PPG children is 93.0%. There 84 pupils with

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attendance under 90% of which 26 are under 85%. Many of these absences are due to unauthorised holidays and Covid. Since the start of the academic year, the school has received absence requests for 72 children to take leave.

The governors asked if there are a lot of families who have relatives overseas? The Headteacher replied that yes, a lot of the unauthorised holidays are to visit family abroad.

The governors asked if other schools are experiencing similar issues?

The Headteacher answered that the SLA schools have reported similar numbers of persistent absentees and that all of the Headteachers are working together to try to improve the situation.

The Headteacher also said that 9 pupils have joined the school having moved to the UK from Hong Kong and that there are families from Ukraine moving into the area. Staff are aware of these pupils and resources are available to support the families.

Behaviour

The Headteacher said that there have been 16 level 3 incidents reported on CPOMS for the current period, 10 of which are for one child. The positive impact of Therapeutic Thinking is starting to be seen and staff have received another training session explaining therapeutic plans for focus pupils. 20/20 Club has been extended to run every day for vulnerable children. Aspirational qualities are being driven through assemblies and PSHE. Whole school assemblies have been reintroduced for the first time since the start of the pandemic. Zones – active zone and a quieter activity area have been created in the playgrounds to encourage pro-social behaviour.

The Headteacher told the governors that parents are often questioning how the school is dealing with incidents and not accepting the reasons given by the teachers. Social skills in children have been impacted by Covid and the school is currently focusing heavily on the aspirational qualities of kindness and collaboration.

A Governor asked if some parents might be concerned that an obstructive child could be impacting the other children in the class and that it may appear that the obstructive child is being compensated.

The Headteacher replied that the idea behind Therapeutic Thinking is not to tell the child off, it is about educating and directing so that the child does not hurt themselves or others.

Information for Parents

- The Headteacher said that the recent PTA Circus was a wonderful community event and thanked all of the governors who helped on the day. Now that the pandemic has passed, volunteers are able to come in to school and trips, performances and the annual Open Afternoon are all being planned as normal.
- SATs week went well.

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- Both KS1 and KS2 are being moderated.
- The SIDP has been updated as the school catering contract has been changed to a new company. Parents have been notified via the bulletin and more information will be sent shortly.
- After many discussions regarding changing school uniform, the Headteacher has sent a survey to parents and if the majority of parents agree, new uniform will be rolled out from September. The survey did not invite comments from parents as it is not possible to take into account everyone's separate views. The Headteacher said that if there is not a clear cut answer, further consultation will take place during the year ahead. A parent governor raised some points from individual parents but it was agreed that this was not the forum to discuss these and that the comments would be looked at as part of the overall strategic consultation.

Recruitment

Recruitment has been taking place for two Teaching Assistants, one Teaching Cover Provider, one Class Teacher, a Phase Leader and an advert is currently live for a Forest School Teacher.

Monitoring

- The SLA Maths Review feedback had been shared with the governors prior to the meeting. Maths standards across the whole school are high and the SLA were very impressed. The Headteacher thanked everyone who was involved.
- A Read Write Inc development day was held in March, staff received coaching and the instructor gave positive feedback on the teaching.

Safeguarding

There have been 8 alerts for this reporting period and one referral to Children's Services.

e-Safety

There have been no alerts for this period.

Children In Care

The school does not currently have any children in care.

The Chair reminded all governors to start to visit the school again and meet with subject leaders. The Chair also reminded the governors to start to fill in governor visit evaluation forms after they have been in to the school now that face to face meetings are once again possible.
